The Obligations of Gov't

 Business processes are similar to private sector

Document handling requirements often differ


- Agencies often refer back to past documents to conduct business (Oso mud slide)
- Must provide documents to the public on request (DSHS 22,000 public disclosure requests per year)
- Long records retention

The Problem to Solve

- No consistent filing scheme
- Employees can't find documents wasted time and frustration



 Mobile: Can't get data to remote users – More duplication




The Problem to Solve




- Duplicate records proliferate






Policy 101 – Tech Policies & Standards



 Prohibits additional investments in agency data centers other than the state data center












TBM Policy & Standards


- Sets expectation for use of designated TBM tool to support the TBM program

☐ Governor's budget office and Legislature need better insight to inform decisions on IT budget requests.




Decision Lens – the tool
