Established by I-276 in 1972 to shine light on the money in politics and promote confidence in the political process.

~7 million records available to the public through our website.

~10,000 elected and appointed officials, lobbyists, political committees and public agencies.



# PDC Strategic Plan

**MISSION:** Promote Confidence in the Political Process

**A. Empower the public to “follow the money” in politics**

1. Real-time access to reports, data, and compliance information.
2. Link entities for both analytics and information discovery.
3. Summary insights and visualizations.
4. Every data point available electronically.

**B. Help regulated community achieve and maintain compliance**

1. Customized, updated requirements and status.
2. Real-time interactive feedback.
3. Intelligent applications that spot common errors.
4. Quick-file on-the-fly.
5. Immediate, relevant and electronic communications.

**C. Continue to build a better, more agile, and more responsive organization**

1. Status at a glance.
2. Intuitive tools for filer assistance.
3. Analysis tools for investigations.
4. Consistent and readily available metrics.
5. Data-driven decision making.
6. Automated processing.

**D. Encourage the public to be part of the process.**

1. Subscribe to anything using the channel of your choice.
2. Cultivate a community through online tools that make participation easier.
3. Transparent processes and progress.
4. Connect people and the political process.

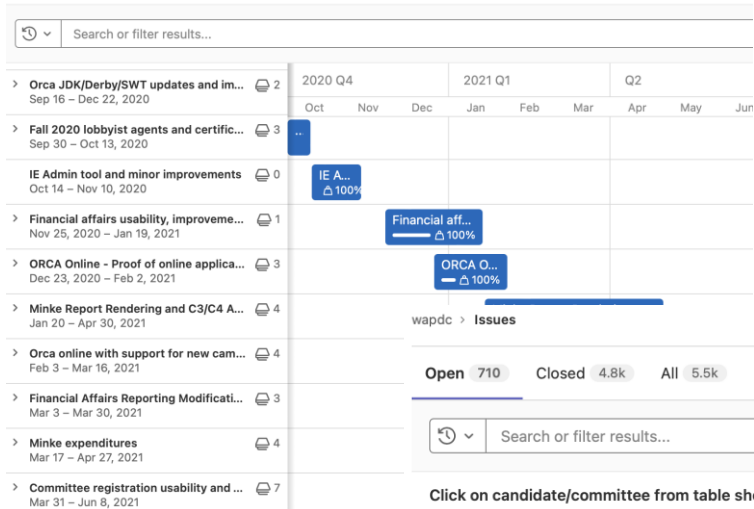

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## Bringing agile to the PDC.

- Never lose the opportunity of being "new"
- Listen for people's pain
- Find a small defined problem with a willing group of conspirators.
- Demonstrate quick success.



# How does this come back to values and moral authority?
