### **Investment Mandate**

arrangement to construct, manage, and operate the nationwide public safety broadband network between the First Responder Network Authority and secondary user to permit—

 (i) access to network capacity on a secondary basis for non-public safety services; and

(ii) the spectrum allocated to such entity to be used for commercial transmissions along the dark fiber of the long-haul network of such entity.

(3) Lease FEES RELATED TO NETWORK EQUIPMENT AND INFRASTRUCTURE.—A fee from any entity that seeks access to or use of any equipment or infrastructure, including antennas or towers, constructed or otherwise owned by the First Responder Network Authority resulting from a public-private arrangement to construct, manage, and operate the nationwide public safety broadband network.

(b) ESTABLISHMENT OF FEE AMOUNTS; PERMANENT SELF-FUNDING.—The total amount of the fees assessed for each fiscal year pursuant to this section shall be sufficient, and shall not exceed the amount necessary, to recoup the total expenses of the First Responder Network Authority in carrying out its duties and responsibilities described under this subtile for the fiscal year involved.

Review.

(c) ANNUAL APPROVAL.—The NTIA shall review the fees assessed under this section on an annual basis, and such fees may only be assessed if approved by the NTIA.

(d) REQUIRED REINVESTMENT OF FUNDS.—The First Responder Network Authority shall reinvest amounts received from the assessment of fees under this section in the nationwide public safety interoperable broadband network by using such funds only for constructing, maintaining, operating, or improving the network.

#### 47 USC 1429. SEC. 6209. AUDIT AND REPORT.

(a) AUDIT .--

(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Commerce shall enter into a contract with an independent auditor to conduct an audit, on an annual basis, of the First Responder Network Authority in accordance with general accounting principles and procedures applicable to commercial corporate transactions. Each audit conducted under this paragraph shall be made available to the appropriate committees of Congress.

(2) LOCATION—Any audit conducted under paragraph (1) shall be conducted at the place or places where accounts of the First Responder Network Authority are normally kept. (3) ACCESS TO FIRST RESPONDER NETWORK AUTHORITY BOOKS AND DOCUMENTS.—

(A) IN GENERAL.—For purposes of an audit conducted under paragraph (1), the representatives of the independent auditor shall—

(i) have access to all books, accounts, records, reports, files, and all other papers, things, or property belonging to or in use by the First Responder Network







## Request Legislation

BRIEF DESCRIPTION:	Concerning the governance of technology services in state government, including eliminating the office of the chief information officer and renaming the consolidated technology services agency.						



## SIEC information:

- Adds language related to policy and standard development to the purpose section of RCW 43.105.006.
- Modifies references to "consolidated technology services" or "consolidated technology services agency" to instead be defined as "Washington technology solutions" throughout all of RCW 43.105.
- Modifies the administration of the SIEC shifts role to the Military Department.

### Bill draft references:

- BILL REQ. #: Z-0456.2/24 2nd draft
- Section 20 of request bill is SIEC "Sec. 20. RCW 43.105.331 and 2017 c 92 s 1 are each amended to read as follows:"
- Section 20 "(4) The ((office)) department shall provide administrative support to the committee."
- "NEW SECTION. Sec. 62. RCW 43.105.331 is recodified as a section in chapter 38.52 RCW."



## **Request legislation notes:**

### **Timeframe:**

- Request legislation to OFM for approval and inclusion in Governor's budget (Nov-Dec 2023).
- Legislature acts on bill (Jan-Mar 2024).
- Earliest implementation June 30, 2024.
- Current structure stays intact.
- No change in SIEC membership.
- Only change in administration, support.
