





Old Policy Limitations

- Ambiguous expectations
- Constrained waiver request process
- Limited strategic thought around future physical compute needs

Goals

- •Statewide data center facility investments narrowed to SDC
- Right size allocation of debt service to help maximize federal participation
- Prompt agency to develop plan to become compliant with RCW

Agency Voiced Concerns

- Timeline too aggressive
- Competing priorities for agency scarce resources
- Organizational change management impact










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LNI – Business Services IT Spend








Interagency Spend (EL) Billing Trend






IT Spend Type





IT Spend Across Government Sectors



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
Increased IT Spend – Higher Education





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
IT Spend by IT Resource Towers






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IT Spend by Cost Pool






Increased IT Spend—Contract Services (External Labor)







Privacy Modeling

- First of a kind effort to create a tool to identify applicable privacy laws for end users
- Will have utility for state and local governments
- A web-based application that takes a set of user inputs (types of personal information) and delivers outputs (guidelines for use based on applicable privacy laws)
- Funded by a Hewlett Foundation grant






